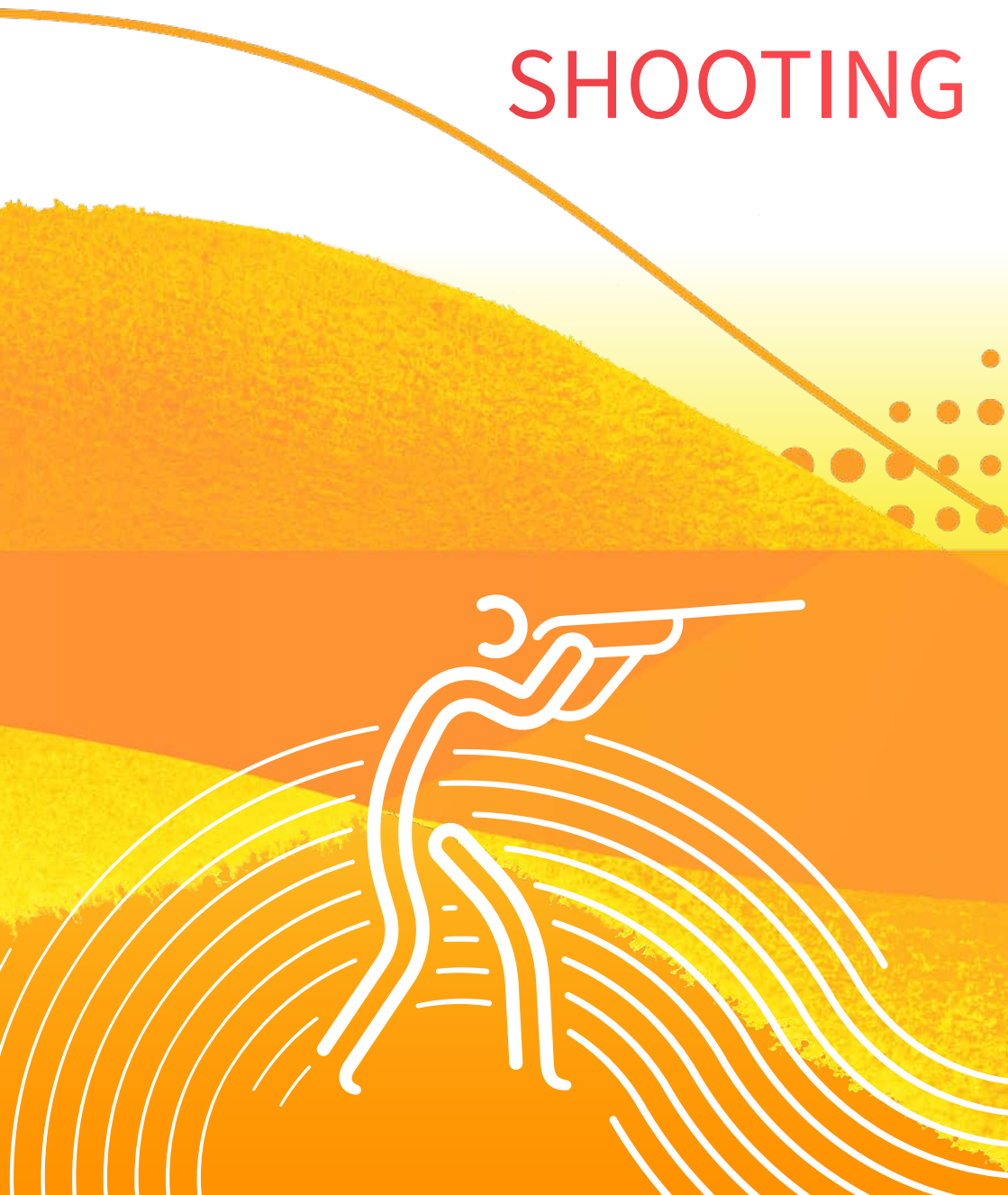

1. Introduction to the 19th Asian Games

Date: 23 September to 8 October 2023

Host City: Hangzhou

Co-host Cities: Ningbo, Wenzhou, Shaoxing, Jinhua, Huzhou

Sports: 40 sports

Venues: 54 competition venues, 31 training venues

1.1 Emblem

“Tides Surging” is the official name of the Emblem. It represents the Qiantang River in Hangzhou, one of three largest river tidal bores in the world.



1.2 Mascots

The three mascots of the 19th Asian Games are Congcong, Chenchen, and Lianlian. They represent the three World Heritage Sites that are located in Hangzhou - the Archaeological Ruins of Liangzhu City, the Beijing-Hangzhou Grand Canal and the West Lake.



1.3 Asian Games Village

The Asian Games Village has three main zones, the Athletes Village (AV), Technical Officials Village (TOV) and Media Village (MEV). The Asian Games Village covers a total land area of 113 hectares and has a total built area of approximately 2.41 million square metres. There are 108 buildings on the site. Moreover, there are two (2) Athletes Sub-villages (hotels) located in Chun'an County and Tonglu County in Hangzhou, and three (3) Athletes Sub-villages (hotels) located in Jinhua, Xiangshan County in Ningbo, and Wenzhou.

1.4 Other Information

2. Accreditation and Validation

The 19th Asian Games Organising Committee (HAGOC) will send the updated Accreditation Guide to responsible organisations in November 2022. Online accreditation will be available from 20 December 2022 to 20 May 2023.

From 20 July 2023 onwards, HAGOC will issue and mail out Pre-valid Hangzhou Asian Games Identity and Accreditation Cards (HAGIACs) to responsible organisations that have confirmed their Accreditation Status Reports. Upon their arrival in Hangzhou, Games participants will be required to validate their Pre-valid HAGIACs, at any Games accreditation facility, by presenting their valid identity documents. Once validated, the HAGIACs will permit access to venues, sites and zones required for the Games participant to perform his or her duties. HAGIAC card holders will have access to the venues, and areas in venues requiring accreditation, indicated on their cards.

3. Validity Period of HAGIACs

Non-Chinese nationals will be allowed multiple entries into/exits from the Chinese mainland between 00:00 on 24 August 2023 and 24:00 on 23 October 2023 (Beijing time) upon presentation of their valid passports (or other international travel documents) and HAGIACs (including electronic identity and accreditation cards or “E-HAGIACs”) issued by HAGOC.

4. Transport

Athletes and team officials will be provided with transport on arrival and when departing and for competitions, training and competition spectating. Services will be available from 9 September to 11 October 2023. HAGOC will allocate a specific number of dedicated vehicles (with drivers) to each NOC delegation for its exclusive use. Please refer to the *Detailed Transport Services Plan for the 19th Asian Games* for more details.

5. Accommodation

During the 19th Asian Games, NOC athletes and team officials will stay in the Athletes Village or Athletes Sub-villages. The Athletes Village has 37 apartment buildings with a total of 2,600 apartments that will be able to accommodate more than 10,000 athletes and team officials. The Athletes Village will officially open on 16 September 2023 and close on 11 October 2023. For security, access to the different zones in the villages will require the appropriate accreditation card.

6. Media Services

6.1 Mixed Zone

Athletes must pass through the mixed zone at the end of a competition, so that they can be interviewed by accredited media as soon as possible after the competition ends. Although athletes must pass through the mixed zone after a competition, they are not obliged to comply with any request to be interviewed.

After a Victory Ceremony, athletes and teams who have won medals

must pass through the mixed zone and allow themselves to be interviewed by accredited media (if necessary).

6.2 Press Conference Room

After the final of each event, in principle, a post-competition press conference will be arranged. A press conference will also be arranged after each competition in team events including in Football, Basketball and Volleyball.

At press conferences, consecutive interpreting will be provided. Translating a participant's native language into English, if needed, should be done by the Press Attaché(s) of the relevant NOC taking part.

6.3 FOP Photo Positions

FOP photo positions will be set up in FOPs or FOP surrounding areas in each competition venue. These positions are for accredited photographers to use to take photos of competitions. Accredited photographers will need to wear supplementary access control devices in order to enter FOP photo positions. For some events, the shooting at the FOP photo positions may use photo truck(s), photo boat(s), catwalk remote control camera(s), shooting house(s), and underwater remote control camera(s).

7. Medical Services

Medical rooms (medical stations) will be set up and ambulances available at competition and training venues. During the opening periods of venues, professional medical staff will provide Games participants with basic medical services, first aid and patient referrals, where needed.

The Polyclinic, which will be set up in the Athletes Village, will have nine (9)

clinical departments including Emergency and Internal Medicine, Emergency Surgery, Orthopaedics, Gynaecology, Ophthalmology, Stomatology, ENT, Acupuncture and Massage, and Rehabilitation Medicine. It will also have five (5) medical laboratories and facilities including a Pharmacy, Ultrasound Lab, ECG Room, Radiology Department and a Clinical laboratory. Professional medical staff will provide basic medical services, first aid and patient referral services to Games participants where needed, 24 hours a day. Basic medical, on-site emergency and patient referral services will be provided free of charge. Other medical services shall be paid for in accordance with the provisions stated in the relevant insurance cover policy. Other costs incurred shall be paid for by the individual receiving treatment.

People suffering from chronic diseases should go to the 19th Asian Games designated hospitals for medical treatment. Diagnosis and treatment of chronic diseases will not be available in medical rooms at venues or in residential zones.

8. Weather Information

8.1 Climate in Hangzhou

Located north of China's southeastern coast, Hangzhou enjoys a subtropical monsoon climate. Over the past 30 years (1991-2020), Hangzhou has recorded an average temperature of 17.5 °C, an average relative humidity of 73.6%, an average annual precipitation of 1491.8mm, and an average of 1642.4 hours of sunshine annually. The average temperature in September is 24.6 °C, the average wind speed is 2.1m/s, and average monthly precipitation is 113.3mm. The average temperature in October is 19.3°C, the average wind speed is 1.9m/s, and average precipitation is 74.1mm monthly. Following is detailed weather information for Hangzhou in September and October over the past 30 years.

Ningbo has a subtropical monsoon climate that is mild with high humidity, four distinct seasons, alternating winter and summer monsoons, and abundant rainfall. Following is detailed weather information for Ningbo in September and October over the past 30 years.

II. Technical Information

1. Competition Date

The Shooting competition of the 19th Asian Games will be held from 24 September to 1 October 2023 at Fuyang Yinhu Sports Centre.

2. Competition Venue

The Shooting competition will be held at Fuyang Yinhu Sports Centre. For Rifle & Pistol and Running Target, there are 78 targets in 10m Range with 436 seats, 50 targets in 25m Range with 707 seats, 60 targets in 50m Range with 520 seats, 3 running targets in 10m Range with 144 seats. And in the Finals Hall, there are 1,188 seats. For Skeet & Trap, there are 4 ranges with a total of 3,177 seats.

The Fuyang Yinhu Sports Centre is used as both training venue and competition venue for the 19th Asian Games, which is 35.8 kilometres away from the Athletes' Village.

6. Competition Rules

The Shooting competition of the 19th Asian Games will be held as per the current ISSF/ASC Rules and Regulations and ISSF/ASC Constitution.

Detailed information is available on the website of the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF): www.issf-sports.org.

The draw must be made under the supervision of the technical delegate following the procedure described in the ISSF Rules and Regulations.

In case of any disagreement in the language interpretation of the rules and regulations, the English version of the ISSF Rules and Regulations and ISSF

Constitution shall prevail. Any unforeseen circumstances not covered by the regulations and rules shall be resolved as follows:

- General issues: Resolved in accordance with the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) Constitution and Rules.
- Technical issues: Resolved in accordance with the ISSF Rules and Regulations.

Non-Olympic event(s) will not have a final competition (as is the practice of previous Asian Games). The qualification ranking of the mixed team event is determined by the total scores of individual qualifications.

7. Competition Format

If the number of entries exceeds firing lanes, the Technical Delegate shall determine the competition format in accordance with the ISSF Rules and Regulations.

7.1 Rifle

- **10m Air Rifle:** Men's Individual, Women's Individual, Men's Team, Women's Team, Mixed Team

Position: Standing

-Qualification stage of Men's and Women's Events

Preparation and Sighting Time: 15 minutes

Match: 60 shots with decimal scoring up to 10.9 per each shot (maximum of 654 scores) within 1 hour 15 minutes. Top eight (8) athletes in the Qualification Round will advance to the Finals.

-Final round (Men's Individual & Women's Individual): Starting positions are assigned according to random draw that is done automatically by the computer.

Two (2) series of five (5) shots are fired in 250 seconds per series. Targets are scored in decimal ring values. Then, single shots are fired in 50 seconds per shot. After every two (2) shots, the lowest-ranking athlete is eliminated. After the 12th shot and 14th shot, shooters with the lowest scores are eliminated in the 8th place and 7th place respectively. The following eliminations are determined every two shots, until the third place (bronze medallist) is decided by the 22th shot and the gold and silver medallists are decided by the 24th and conclusive shot.

* There will be no Final Stage for the team events. Teams are ranked by the sum of the qualification results of the athletes (or by the elimination results if any).

● **Mixed Team**

Qualification Stage:

Preparation and Sighting Time: 10 minutes

Match: Each athlete of each team will fire 30 shots in 30 minutes with decimal scoring up to 10.9 per each shot (maximum of 654 scores). Top two (2) teams in the Qualification Stage will progress to the Gold Medal Match, and teams of the 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th places will progress to two (2) Bronze Medal Matches. The 4th and 5th teams will participate in the first Bronze Medal Match and the 3rd and 6th teams in the second,

Final (Medal Match): The Gold Medal Match and the Bronze Medal Matches will be organised in the same procedures. Two (2) Bronze Medal Matches will take place before the the Gold Medal Match.

Score starts from zero. The two (2) teams will fire single shot on command (50 seconds per shot). Two (2) points are awarded to the highest value, and one (1) point to tied scores. The winner will be the first team to score 16 points.

● **50m Rifle 3 Positions:** Men's Individual, Women's Individual, Men's Team, Women's Team;

Position: Kneeling, Prone and Standing positions.

Qualification Stage:

Preparation and Sighting Time: 15 minutes

Match: 3 x 20 shots in 1 hour 30 minutes in the sequence of kneeling, prone and standing positions. Full ring scoring will be used scoring up to 10 per each shot (maximum of 600 scores). Top eight (8) athletes in the Qualification Stage will progress to the Final Stage. If there is a tie in top eight (8) athletes, the athletes with higher scores in the last 20 shots will progress to the Final Stage.

- Final round (Men's Individual & Women's Individual): Starting positions are assigned according to random draw that is done automatically by the computer. Eight (8) athletes shoot simultaneously in kneeling, prone, and standing positions successively. Targets are scored in decimal ring values. The final starts with 15 shots in the kneeling position, followed by 15 shots in the prone position and 10 shots in the standing position. At the end of the standing series (after the 40th shot), the shooters with the two (2) lowest scores are eliminated in the 8th place and 7th place. Then, the five (5) final single shots are fired. After every single shot, the lowest ranking athlete is eliminated until the third place (bronze medallist) is decided by the 44th shot and the gold and silver medallists are decided by the 45th shot.

* There will be no Final Stage for the team events. Teams are ranked by the sum of the qualification results of the athletes (or by the elimination results if any).

7.2 Pistol

● **10m Air Pistol:** Men's Individual, Women's Individual, Men's Team, Women's Team, Mixed Team

Position: Standing

Men's & Women's Events:

Qualification Stage:

Preparation and Sighting Time: 15 minutes

Match: 60 shots within 1 hour 15 minutes. Full ring scoring will be used

scoring up to 10 per each shot (maximum of 600 scores). Top eight (8) athletes will advance to the Final Stage.

- Final round: Starting positions are assigned according to random draw that is done automatically by the computer. The final starts with two (2) five-shot series in 250 seconds per series. Targets are scored in decimal ring values. Then, single shots are fired in 50 seconds per shot. After every two (2) shots, the lowest-ranking athlete is eliminated. After the 12th shot and 14th shot, shooters with the lowest scores are eliminated in the 8th place and 7th place respectively. The following eliminations are determined every two (2) shots, until the third place (bronze medalist) is decided by the 22th shot and the gold and silver medallists are decided by the 24th and conclusive shot.

* There will be no Final Stage for the team events. Teams are ranked by the sum of the qualification results of the athletes (or by the elimination results if any).

● Mixed Team

Qualification Stage:

Preparation and Sighting Time: 15 minutes

Match: Each athlete of each team will fire 30 shots in 30 minutes. Full ring scoring will be used scoring up to 10 per each shot (maximum of 600 scores). The team result consists of the scores obtained by the male and female athletes. Top two (2) teams will progress to the Gold Medal Match, and teams of the 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th places will progress to two (2) Bronze Medal Matches. The 4th and 5th teams will participate in the first Bronze Medal Match and the 3rd and 6th teams in the second,

Final (Medal Match): The Gold Medal Match and the Bronze Medal Matches will be organized in the same procedures. Two (2) Bronze Medal Matches will take place before the the Gold Medal Match.

Score starts from zero. The two (2) teams will fire single shot on command (50 seconds per shot). Two (2) points are awarded to the highest value, and one (1)

point to tied scores. The winner will be the first team to score 16 points.

● 25m Rapid Fire Pistol: Men's Individual, Men's Team

Position: Standing

-Qualification Stage: 60 Shots in Two Stages. Each Stage consists of 30 shots including 8-second 2x5 shots, 6-second 2x5 shots, and 4-second 2x5 shots. Full Ring Scoring will be used. Scores of the two (2) stages will be added up. Top six (6) athletes will advance to the Final Stage.

- Final round: Starting positions are assigned according to random draw that is done automatically by the computer. The finalists start the match with zero (0) point and shoot each five-shot series within four (4) seconds. A score of 9.7 or higher counts as a hit. All athletes fire shots in sequence on command. At the end of the 4th series (after the 20th shot), the athlete with the lowest score is eliminated in the 6th place. At the end of each series followed, the lowest ranking athlete is eliminated, until the third place (bronze medalist) is decided at the end of the 7th series (after the 35th shot) and gold and silver medallists are decided at the end of the 8th series (after the 40th shot). If there is a tie for the lowest ranking athlete to be eliminated, the tie will be broken by one or more additional shoot-off shots.

* There will be no Final Stage for the team events. Teams are ranked by the sum of the qualification results of the athletes (or by the elimination results if any).

● 25m Pistol: Women's Individual, Women's Team

Position: Standing

-Qualification Stage: 60 shots in two stages including 30 shots in the precision stage and 30 shots in the rapid stage, will be fired with full ring scoring (maximum of 600 scores). Before each stage, there will be five (5) sighting shots. For each stage, there will be a preparation time of three (3) minutes.

Rapid fire	6x5 shots	3 second per shot

Top eight (8) athletes in the Qualification Stage will progress to the Final Stage.

- Final round: Starting positions are assigned according to random draw that is done automatically by the computer. The finalists start the match with zero (0) point and shoot each five-shot series within 7/3 seconds. A score of 10.2 or higher counts as a hit. All athletes fire shots simultaneously on command. At the end of the 4th series (after the 20th shot), the athlete with the lowest score is eliminated in the 8th place. At the end of each series followed, the lowest ranking athlete is eliminated, until the third place (bronze medallist) is decided at the end of the 9th series (after the 45th shot) and gold and silver medallists are decided at the end of the 10th series (after the 50th shot).

* There will be no Final Stage for the team events. Teams are ranked by the sum of the qualification results of the athletes (or by the elimination results if any).

7.3 Running Target

● **10m Running Target:** Men's Individual, Women's Individual, Men's Team, Women's Team

Position: Standing

Targets: Targets will move from right to left and left to right.

Men's & Women's Qualification:

Two stages: 30 precision-fire shots with a time limit of five (5) seconds per shot; 30 rapid-fire shots with a time limit of 2.5 seconds. Full ring scoring will be used scoring up to 10 per each shot (maximum of 600 scores)..

Medals are awarded according to qualifying rankings.

● **10m Running Target Run Mixed:** Men's Individual, Men's Team

Position: Standing

Targets: Targets will move from right to left and left to right.

Qualification: The speed of targets will change randomly. 20 precision-fire shots with a time limit of five (5) seconds per shot; 20 rapid-fire shots with a time limit of 2.5 seconds. Full ring scoring will be used scoring up to 10 per each shot (maximum of 400 scores).

Medals are awarded according to qualifying rankings.

7.4 Shotgun

● **Skeet:** Men's Individual, Women's Individual, Men's Team, Women's Team

Position: Standing

-Qualification Stage: Men's & Women's Individual: Five (5) rounds of 25 targets, or a total of 125 targets, with hit or miss scoring a maximum of 125 hits. The top six (6) athletes from the Qualification or any shoot-offs advance to the final match. New bib numbers (1-6), which are distributed according to the athletes' rankings, are used in the final round.

-Final round: All six (6) finalists will shoot, in sequence, at 20 targets, with one (1) regular double and one (1) reverse double on station 3, one (1) regular double on station 4, one (1) regular double and one (1) reverse double on station 5, one (1) regular double and one (1) reverse double on station 3, one (1) reverse double on station 4, and one (1) regular double and one (1) reverse double on station 5. After the six (6) finalists complete 20 targets, the 6th place athlete will be decided;

The five (5) remaining finalists will shoot another 10 targets, with one (1) regular double and one (1) reverse double on station 3, one (1) regular double on station 4, and one (1) regular double and one (1) reverse double on station 5.

After 30 targets, the 5th place athlete will be decided;

The four (4) remaining finalists will shoot another 10 targets with one (1) regular double and one (1) reverse double on station 3, one (1) reverse double on station 4, and one (1) regular double and one (1) reverse double on station 5. After 40 targets, the 4th place athlete will be decided;

The three (3) remaining athletes will shoot another 10 targets, with one (1) regular double and one (1) reverse double on station 3, one (1) regular double on station 4, and one (1) regular double and one (1) reverse double on station 5. After 50 targets, the 3rd place athlete (bronze medalist) will be decided;

The two (2) remaining athletes will shoot another 10 targets, with one (1) regular double and one (1) reverse double on station 3, one (1) reverse double on station 4, and one (1) regular double and one (1) reverse double on station 5. After 60 targets, the gold and silver medal winners (1st and 2nd places) will be decided, in case of a tie there is an immediate shoot-off; and on station 4, the referee must inform the first finalist whether the double is a regular double or a reverse double.

* There will be no Final Stage for the team events. Teams are ranked by the sum of the qualification results of the athletes.

● **Skeet Mixed Team:** Mixed Team

Position: Standing

-Qualification Stage:

Mixed Team: The total score of a team equals the male athlete's score plus female athlete's score. Every athlete on a team will shoot at three (3) rounds of 25 targets, or a total of 75 targets (i.e. 150 targets per team). Top six (6) teams will progress to the Final Stage. If there is a tie in top six (6), the shoot-off will only take place in station 4.

-Final round: The finalists start the match with zero (0) point. The final is in two (2) parts consisting of Final Stage 1 to decide the bronze medal 1(Place 3

- 5 and bronze medal 2 Place 4 – 6) and Final Stage 2 to decide the gold and silver medals. Final Stage 1 consists of the mixed teams in positions 3 , 4 , 5 , and 6 after Qualification or any eventual shoot-offs. Final Stage 2 consists of the mixed teams in positions 1 and 2 after Qualification or any eventual shoot-offs. Final Stage 1 will be shot first, followed by Final Stage 2.

The starting positions in the final are decided by the bib number of each mixed team on the basis of their qualification ranking and any eventual shoot-offs after qualification (the lower bib number team to shoot first followed by the higher bib number team). Before the start, athletes will be allowed to test fire only. There will be no showing of targets, as this will be conducted during the presentation of all the qualified mixed teams in the final. The preparation time limit on each station is 30 seconds, monitored by an electronic timer managed by a referee selected from among the appointed referees. The two (2) mixed teams (composed of four athletes) will start from 0 and complete on stations 3, 4, 5, 3, 4 and 5 until the winners are decided as follows: The mixed team with the lower bib number will shoot first, starting from station 3 and followed by the second mixed team. The two (2) athletes from each mixed team will each shoot, in bib number order, two (2) doubles (one (1) normal and one (1) reverse double), four (4) shots (eight (8) shots per mixed team). The shooting sequence (which team will shoot first) will alternate between the two (2) mixed teams after each station (i.e. On station 4, the second team will shoot first, followed by the first team. On station 5, the first team will shoot first, followed by the second team and so on.) The combined scores for each team after each station will be carried forward to the next station. This process will continue in sequence on stations 3, 4, 5, 3, 4 and 5 (six (6) stations) and the mixed team with the highest combined score will be the winner. If the shooting sequence is completed on all six (6) stations and there is a tied score, the winning mixed team will be decided by a shoot-off. (See Rule 9.20.3.3 in ISSF Statutes, Rules and Regulations as below.)

Procedure of Skeet Mixed Team during shoot-offs in final: The starting positions in the event of a shoot-off in Final Stages 1 and 2 will be decided by the bib number of each team. The lower bib number team will shoot first, followed by the second team. The athletes of each mixed team will shoot in bib number order, one behind the other. This order of shooting between the two (2) members of each team must remain the same throughout the shoot-off. The shoot-off will be conducted on stations 3, 4, and 5. The athletes of the mixed team with the lower bib number must line up behind station 3 and each shoot at a normal double in bib number order. Likewise, the athletes of the second team will each shoot at a normal double in bib order number. The team with the higher number of hits out of the four (4) shots (2+2=4) will be the winner. If the tie is not broken, the same sequence must continue on the same station but with reverse doubles. If the tie is not broken on station 3, the same procedure will continue in the same order and sequence on station 4. If the tie is still not broken, then station 5, with the members of each team shooting first at normal and then at reverse doubles until the tie is broken. If the tie remains, athletes will continue to shoot in the same sequence but starting with reverse and then normal doubles at stations 3, 4, and 5 until the tie is broken. The preparation time limit is 15 seconds, monitored by an electronic timer managed by a referee selected from among the appointed referees. There will be no target observation or test fire before the shoot-offs in final.

● **Trap:** Men's Individual, Women's Individual, Men's Team, Women's Team

Position: Standing

-Qualification Stage

Men's & Women's Events: Five (5) rounds of 25 targets, or a total of 125 targets, with hit or miss scoring a maximum of 125 hits. The top six (6) athletes from the Qualification advance to the final match. New bib numbers (1-6), which are distributed according to the athletes' rankings, are used in the final round.

- Final round: The finalists start the match with zero (0) point and shoot one (1) shot only at each target. Finalists occupy stations 1-2-3-4-5-6 in bib number order (see 6.19.6.3 in ISSF Statutes, Rules and Regulations, lowest bib number on station 1). After each athlete has shot on a station, he/she must move to the next station to fire in sequence. A timing system to control the 12-second preparation time limit must be used. Each final consists of a series of target sequences followed by progressive eliminations that continue until gold and silver medallists are decided, as follows:

(1) After the six (6) finalists complete a normal round of 25 targets, the 6th place athlete is decided;

(2) After the five (5) remaining finalists shoot at another 5 targets and complete 30 targets, the 5th place athlete is decided;

(3) After the four (4) remaining finalists shoot at another 5 targets and complete 35 targets, the 4th place athlete is decided;

(4) After the three (3) remaining finalists shoot at another 5 targets and complete 40 targets, the 3rd place athlete (bronze medallist) is decided;

(5) After the two (2) remaining finalists shoot at another 10 targets and complete 50 targets, the 1st and 2nd places (gold and silver medallists) are decided. In case of a tie, there will be an immediate shoot-off.

* There will be no Final Stage for the team events. Teams are ranked by the sum of the qualification results of the athletes (or by the elimination results if any).

7.5 Draw- Principles for Firing Point Allocation

The random allocation of athletes to firing points and relays must be done under the supervision of the Technical Delegate with a computer program designed for this purpose or by the drawing of lots. Whenever draws are used to determine firing positions the Technical Delegate must approve the range constraints to be taken into account. Individual athletes and teams (nations)

should be able to shoot under conditions that are as near to equal as possible. Athletes from the same team should not be allocated adjacent firing positions. Athletes from the same team should be divided as equitably as possible between relays.

7.6 Tie-breaking Rules

10m/25m/50m event:

In case of a tie in 10m/25m/50m event, the following rules shall be applied: (ISSF GENERAL TECHNICAL RULES 6.15.1)

- The highest number of Inner Tens (indicated as X);
- The highest score of the last 10-shot series working backward by 10-shot series in full ring scoring until the tie is broken;
- If any ties remain, scores will be compared on a shot-by-shot basis using inner tens (i.e. an inner ten outranks a 10) beginning with the last shot, then the next to the last shot, etc. until the tie is broken;
- If any ties remain, and ESTs are used, scores will be compared on a shot-by-shot basis using decimal ring scores beginning with the last shot, then the next to the last shot, etc. until the tie is broken;
- If any ties remain, the athletes must have the same ranking and must be listed in Latin alphabetical order using the athlete's family name;

When decimal scoring is used for 10m Air Rifle or 50m Rifle Prone Elimination or Qualification events, ties will be broken by the highest score of the last ten-shot series, etc. (decimal scores) and then by comparing decimal scores on a shot-by-shot basis beginning with the last shot, then the next to the last shot, etc. until the tie is broken.

Shotgun:

Trap: After the Qualification stage of 125 targets, the six (6) highest-ranking athletes will qualify for the final. Any ties for places 1 to 6 will be broken by shoot-

offs in accordance with the shoot-off procedures for Trap after Qualification (Rule 9.15.5.2 in ISSF Statutes, Rules and Regulations).

Skeet: After the Qualification stage of 125 targets, the six (6) highest-ranking athletes will qualify for the final. Any ties for places 1 to 6 will be broken by shoot-offs in accordance with the shoot-off procedures for Skeet after Qualification (Rule 9.15.5.4 in ISSF Statutes, Rules and Regulations).

Skeet Mixed Team: Any ties after the Qualification stage will be decided by a shoot-off in accordance with the Procedure During Shoot-offs After Qualification (Rule 6.20.3 in the ISSF Statutes, Rules and Regulations).

Running Target: (Running Target Rule 10.12)

- Ties for athletes with perfect scores will not be broken.
- Ties for the First Three (3) Places and Below
- If two (2) or more athletes shoot equal scores, ties for the first three (3) individual places must be decided by a shoot-off to be arranged by the Jury. This shoot-off consists of two (2) sighting shots (one (1) left - one (1) right) and two (2) competition shots (one (1) left - one (1) right) in 2.5 seconds (fast run); in the event of a further tie, the shoot-off will continue until the tie is broken.

Ties in team events must be decided by totalling the results of all members of a team and applying these tie-breaking steps:

- The highest total number of inner tens;
- The highest total score on the last series, then the next to the last series, etc.;
- If any ties remain, total scores will be compared on shot-by-shot basis using inner tens, beginning with the last shot, then the next to the last shot etc. until the tie is broken.

7.7 Bib Rules

All athletes must be provided with a bib to wear on the back of the outer

garment above the waistline during the entire qualification. The bib must display the athlete's allocated number for the competition, last name, initial of first name, and nation (IOC abbreviation only). If the bib is available and not worn, the athlete may not compete.

8. Sport Entries

8.1 Eligibility

-Only NOCs that are members of the OCA are entitled to send athletes to compete in the Shooting competition of the 19th Asian Games.

-Only athletes who comply with the OCA Constitution and Rules and its Bylaws are entitled to compete in the Shooting competition.

8.2 Entry Timeline

-Entry by Sport -Deadline: 24:00 20 February 2021 (Beijing Time, GMT +8)

-Entry by Number -Deadline:24:00 15 March 2023 (Beijing Time, GMT +8)

-Entry by Name - Deadline: 24:00 15 July 2023 (Beijing Time, GMT +8)

8.3 Entry Policies

Individual Events: Each NOC may enter a maximum of three (3) athletes per event.

Only two athletes (2) per NOC will be ranked.

Team Events: Each NOC may enter a maximum of one (1) team per event, each of which consists of three (3) athletes who participate in Individual event.

Mixed Team Events: Each NOC may enter a maximum of one (1) team per event, including one (1) male athlete and one (1) female athlete.

Total: each NOC may enter a maximum of twenty (20) male and nineteen (19) female athletes in the Shooting competition.

Firearm and Ammunition Forms are also required from each athlete.

Any NOC that withdraws its athletes or teams after the submission of the final entries by name or the Team Draw Stage will be faced with disciplinary action by the OCA Executive Board.

10. Technical Officials and Jury of Appeal

10.1 Technical Officials

International technical officials must be accredited by the ISSF, and shall be appointed or recommended by the Asian Shooting Confederation (ASC).

National technical officials shall be appointed by the Chinese Shooting Association (CSA).

AF/IF has the right to appoint the Technical Delegate and International Technical Officials (ITOs) in coordination and approval of the OCA. In the event of any violation of the AF/IF Rules or Games Rules and Regulations by any participant, the OCA has the right to revoke his or her accreditation card and propose replacement of the participant concerned to the relevant party.

10.2 Jury (38)

The member of Jury shall be appointed by the ASC with the approval of the ISSF. It's made up of:

- Technical Delegate: 2 (Rifle/Pistol/Running Target = 1, Shotgun = 1)
- ASC coordinator: 1
- Rifle/Pistol/Running Target: 19
- Jury of Appeal: 3 (2 foreigners, 1 host) Rifle/Pistol/Running Target.
- RTS Jury: 4 (3 foreigners, 1 host)

Rifle Jury: 3 (2 foreigners, 1 host)

Pistol Jury: 3 (2 foreigners, 1 host)

Running Target Jury: 3 (2 foreigners, 1 host)

Equipment Control Jury: 3 (2 foreigners, 1 host)

-Shotgun: 16

Jury of Appeal: 3 (2 foreigners, 1 host)

Shotgun Jury: 5 (4 foreigners, 1 host)

Shotgun Technical Officials: 8 (4 foreigners, 4 host)

11. Technical Meeting

The technical meeting will be held at 14:00 on 22 September 2023 for Rifle & Pistol at Fuyang Yinhu Sports Centre.

The technical meeting will be held at 13:00 on 25 September 2023 for Shotgun at Fuyang Yinhu Sports Centre.

12. Protests and Appeals

Protests concerning any decisions made by the Technical Delegate shall be handled as per the ISSF Rules and Regulations. All appeals of a technical nature will be the responsibilities of relevant International and Asia Federations.

Any athlete/NOC may appeal to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS), in the event that the athlete/NOC believes that there has been a violation of ISSF/ASC. Technical Rules or the OCA Constitution, as long as the appeal is not related to reversing the decision of the referee or the result.

13. Equipment and Clothing

Equipment used and clothing worn by athletes and other relevant participants in the competition must comply with the rules and regulations of the OCA and the ISSF in force.

Neither athletes nor technical officials will be permitted to attach any form of commercial advertising to his or her competition uniform without prior approval from the OCA and the Hangzhou Asian Games Organising Committee.

14. Doping Control

In order to ensure healthy and fair competitions and protect the interests of the athletes, the Anti-doping programme of the 19th Asian Games will be conducted in strict accordance with the World Anti-doping Code and the OCA Anti-doping Rules

15. Victory Ceremony

Gold, silver and bronze medal will be awarded to the athletes ranked the top three of each individual event respectively. In each team event, gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to each of the team members in the top three teams, respectively.

Fifteen minutes before the Victory Ceremony starts, the medalists shall be escorted to the Waiting Area to get ready for the ceremony. Medalists must wear their NOC official uniforms.

16. Sport Information Centre (SIC)

All sport-specific information for Shooting will be available at the sport information desks. They will be located at the competition venue and at the Sport Information Centre (SIC) in the Athletes' Village.

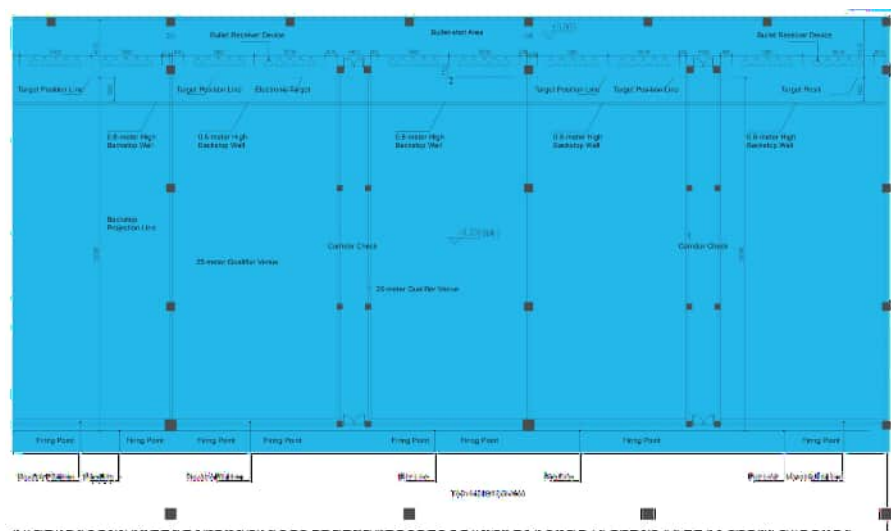

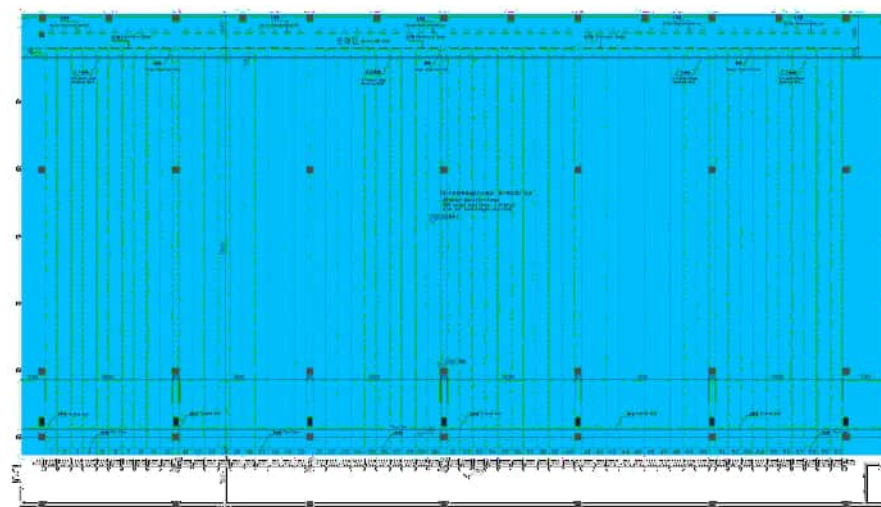

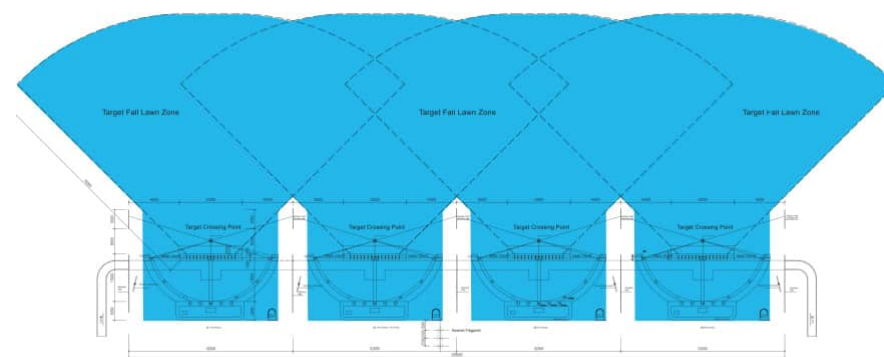

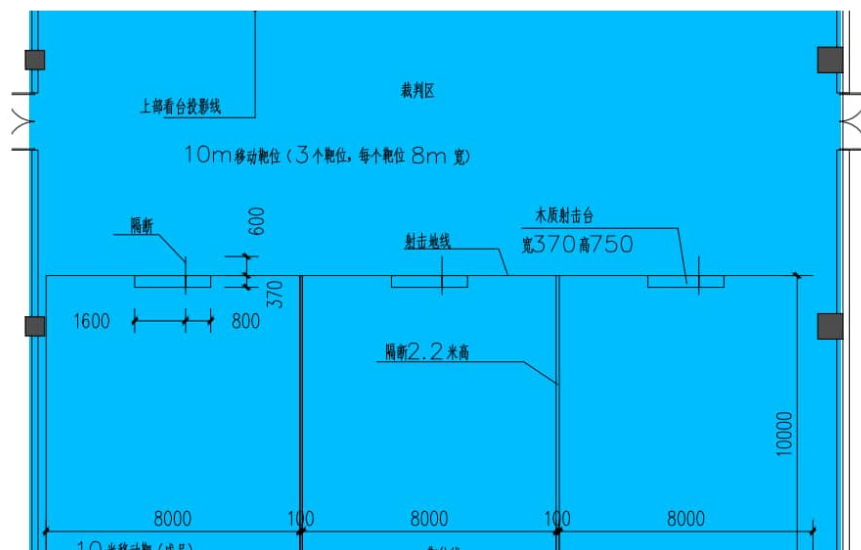

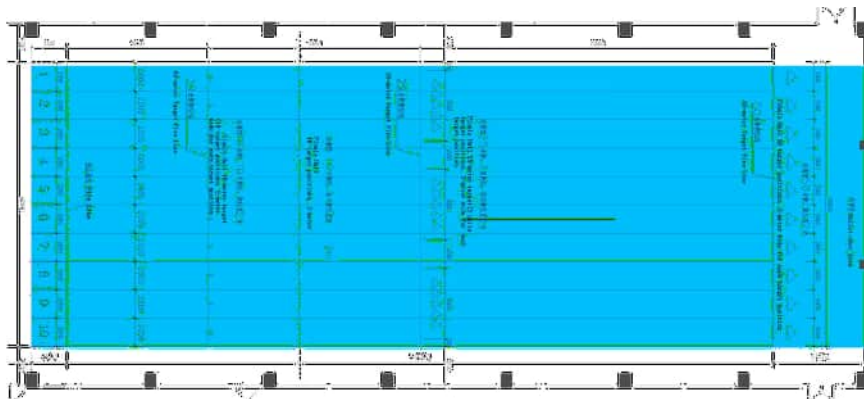
