Thank you very much dear friends for your unwavering support and let us continue to write the next chapter of our Confederation's success story, hand in hand.

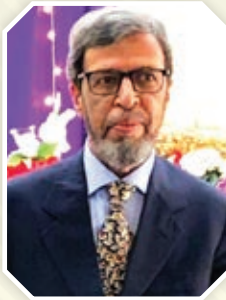

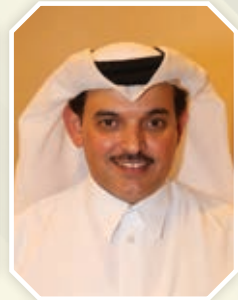

The 34th Executive Committee Meeting of Asian Shooting Confederation (ASC) was held via video conference on Tuesday,30-Nov-2021.

The ASC President welcomed all Executive Committee members and thanked all on the successful organization of ASC General Assembly Meeting held on 27-Nov-2021.

This Executive Committee meeting was organized mainly to execute the decisions of ASC General Assembly and to adopt a system for distribution of Asian Continental Quota Places for Paris Olympic Games 2024.

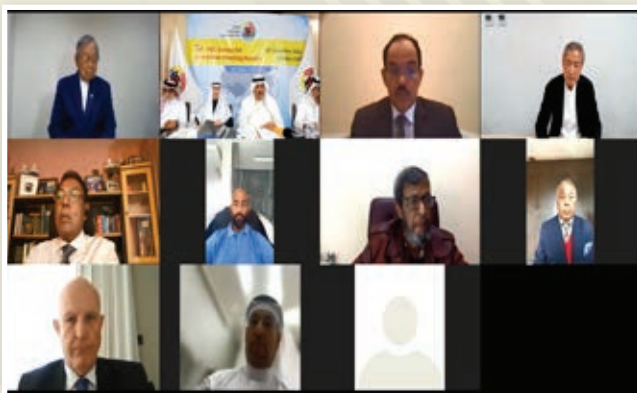
The Executive Committee approved that 48 quota places for Paris Olympic Games 2024 will be distributed in three Asian Shooting Championships in the year 2023 and 2024.

The Executive Committee considered the situation of the Afghan Federation and athletes on humanitarian grounds and decided to allow them to continue attending ASC events/competitions until the situation improves.

The Executive Committee discussed the proposal received from ASC Vice President H.E. Javaid Lodhi to create a Athletes Committee in order to get the opinions / recommendations of athletes of Shooting Sport in Asia and submit proposals to ASC Executive Committee for its consideration to improve shooting sport in Asia and make efforts / policies to address the difficulties faced by the athletes. The Executive Committee referred this proposal to ASC Technical & Judges Committee and Statutes Committee for further study and decision.

On the other hand, the Online Coaching and Youth Training Camp in Air Rifle and Trap will be organized in 2022.

The Executive Committee decided to extend the deadline for submitting the ASC Survey. Thirty-three of the 46 member federations have already submitted the survey.



Meeting to plan and organize online courses for Asian Judges, Athletes and Coaches via Video Conference (12Dec2021)

In carrying out the decisions of ASC Executive Committee, a team was formed to plan and organize online/physical courses for Coaches, Judges and Athletes in Asia, which held its first meeting via video conference on 12-Dec-2021. Main points of discussion were as follows:

- To educate Asian Judges on new ISSF Event Format and Create a series of videos that explains the new ISSF Final format changes for athletes and Judges.
- To plan and organize courses for Juniors.

Meeting to plan and organize online courses for Asian Judges, Athletes and Coaches via Video Conference (22Dec2021)

Following points were discussed during the meeting:

- ISSF new Ranking System.
- Refresher courses for Judges on ISSF new final event format.
- Entry level / beginner courses for Judges in Asia.
- Advanced courses for judges, coaching courses and courses for athletes.
- ASC Judges License and Youth Training Camps.

Meeting to plan and organize online courses for Asian Judges, Athletes and Coaches via Video Conference (05Jan2022)

Following points were discussed during the meeting:

- Judges Courses.
- Coaching Courses.
- Youth Training Camps.

ISSF Executive Committee Video Meeting (16Jan2022)

Important points of discussion were as follows:

- Discussion on matters related to Paris 2024.
- Approval of the Continental Confederations proposals on the Championships with Quota Places allocation.
- Discussion on the 2023-2024 World Cups and Grand Prix where points for the Qualification Ranking for the Olympic Games can be obtained.
- Testing and control of the new formats during the Grand Prix and World Cups in January – April 2022.
- Proposals for the optimization of the ISSF Ranking system (World Ranking and Qualification Ranking for the Olympic Games).
- Decision on establishing the Nominations Committee vis-à-vis 2022 elections.

ASC Online Training Academy Meeting (13Feb2022)

Following decision were taken during the meeting:

- Online Shotgun Judges/Referees' course will be organized in third week of March. 65 participants may be segregated into three batches and three separate courses may be organized.
- Refresher Courses for Rifle/Pistol Judges will be organized after ISSF World Cup in Cairo.
- The Pistol Coaching Course will be organized in the month of March 2022.
- ASC Headquarters to send circular to all member federations about the dates of these courses.
- Separate courses will be organized for 09 federations (having no ISSF Judges License holders) to train and help them get technical knowledge to conduct events at National level and subsequently get ISSF judges' license.

Training Camp of Kazakhstan Sports Shooting Federation (25Jan-13Feb 2022)

Asian Shooting Confederation and Kuwait Shooting Federation jointly supervised and organized a training camp for 72 athletes from Kazakhstan Sports Shooting Federation from 25-Jan-2022 to 13-Feb-2022 at Sheikh Sabah AlAhmad Olympic Shooting Complex, Kuwait.

Athletes from Kazakhstan and Kuwait also got the opportunity to participate in Sheikh Sabah AlSalem AlHomoud AlSabah competition from 03-05 Feb 2022.



ISSF Executive Committee Meeting (07March 2022) at Cairo, Egypt

The friendship tournament was supervised by Asian Shooting Confederation with the purpose to encourage federations to work closely with their Paralympic federations to elevate the skills of special needs athletes and include them in shooting competitions, allowing them to participate with other athletes.

The online competition was successfully organized, and the performance of athletes was fascinating. The athletes performed outstandingly and competed professionally with each other.

Online Course for Asian Shotgun Judges / Referees (23Apr2022)

Asian Shooting Confederation organized an online refreshment course for Asian Shotgun Judges/ Referees on ISSF New Competition Format on 23-Apr-2022.

The purpose of the course was to enlighten and prepare Asian Juries and Referees for ISSF and ASC competitions that will implement the new format in all upcoming competitions, including Olympic Games Paris 2024. The course was attended by 34 Judges and Referees from 16 member federations.



ASC Survey

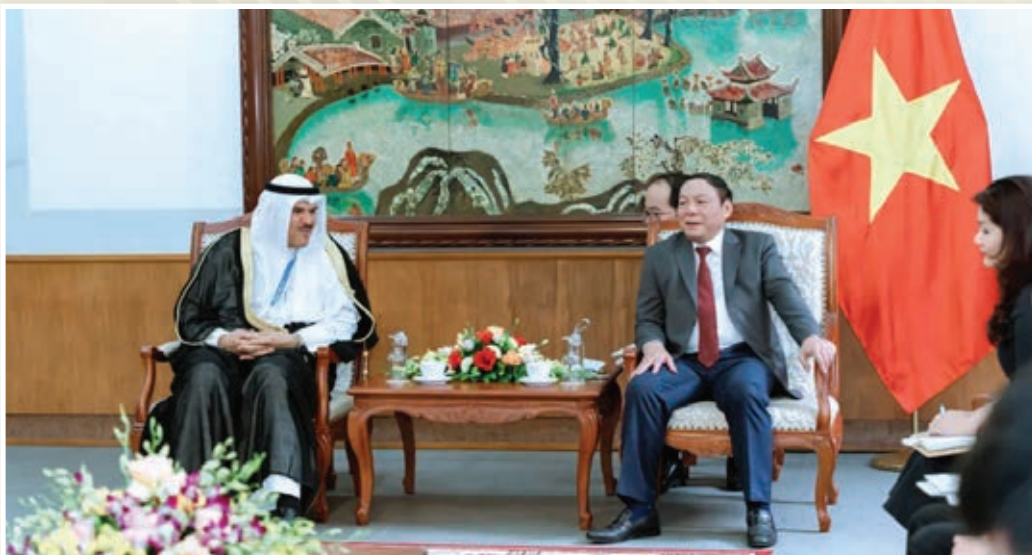
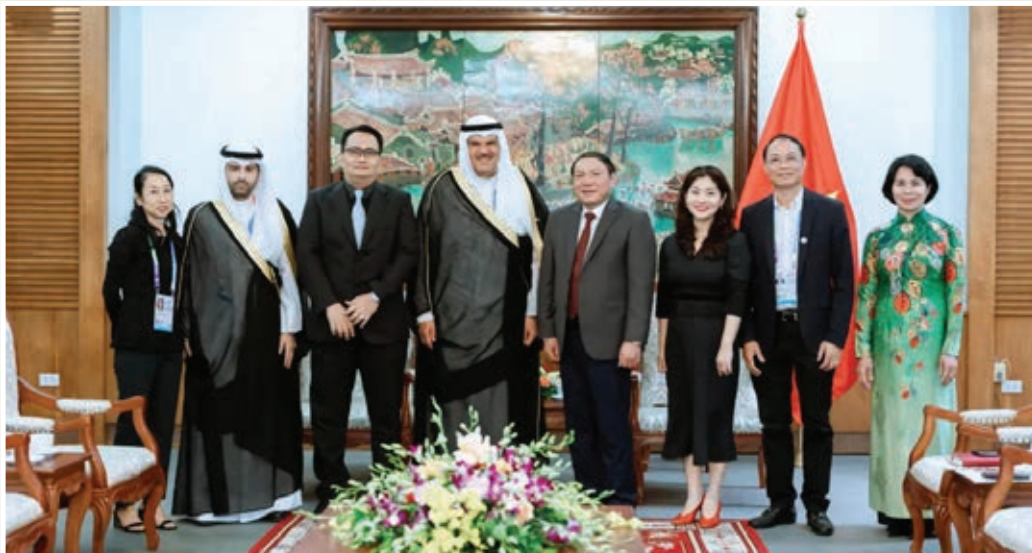
In November 2021, ASC Headquarters initiated a Survey to better understand the challenges being faced by Asian federations in developing the shooting sport, to uplift the performance of athletes and to prepare a comprehensive plan for further improvement, enhancement, and promotion of shooting sport. The survey was completed by 39 out of 46 federations.

Based on the outcome of ASC Survey that was completed in May 2022, the ASC made its utmost efforts to elevate the shooting sport in Asia. Hence, the ASC organized a few courses for juries and referees and several training & coaching camps for youth and juniors. Fortunately, we have noticed considerable improvement in the results of Asian athletes in the last few ISSF and Asian competitions.

Visit of ASC Delegation to Hanoi, Vietnam during 31st SEA Games (May2022)

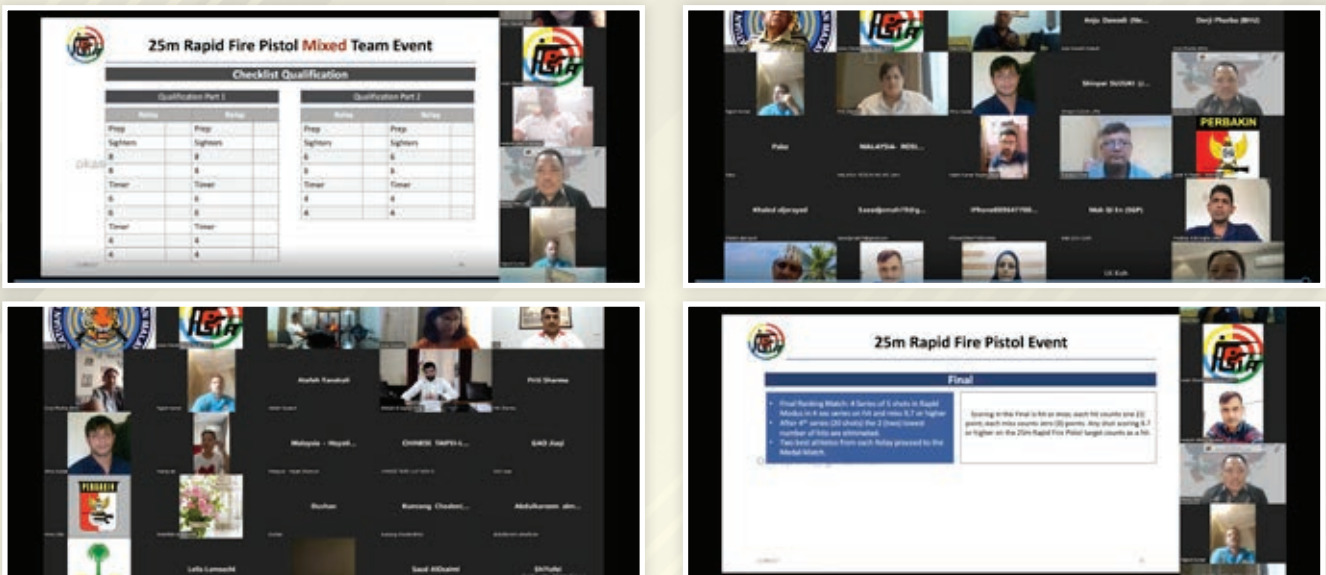

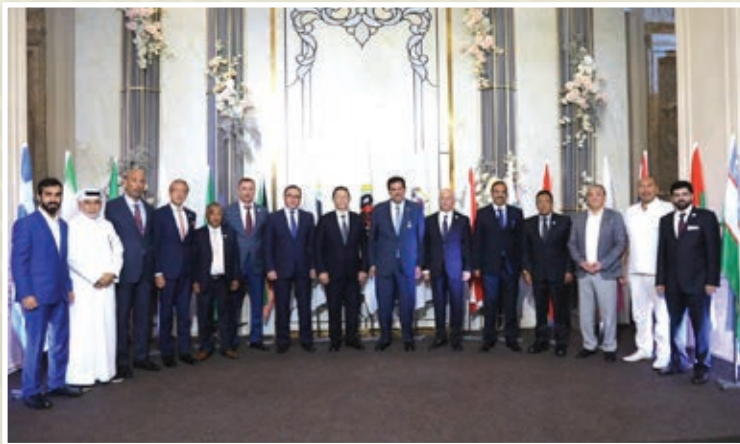

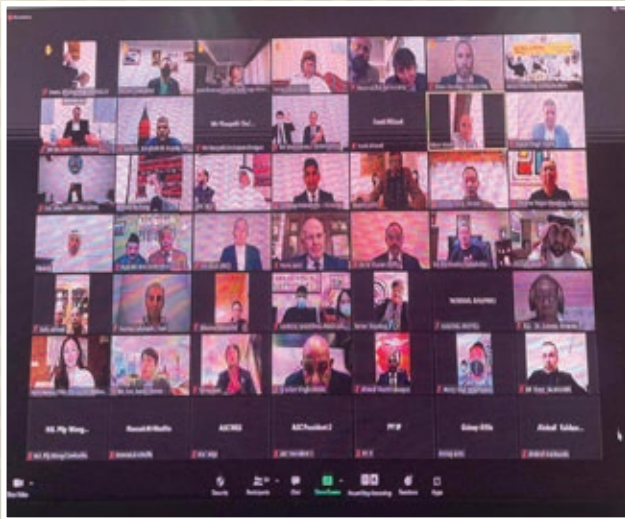
A meeting of Asian Shooting Confederation General Assembly was successfully held on 27 Nov 2021 through video conference.

The Liberation Tower

The Liberation Tower is the second tallest tower in Kuwait, and the fifth tallest telecommunication tower in the world. It is the symbol of Kuwaiti Liberation, and represents the country's resurgence. Officially unveiled by the late Kuwaiti Amir, Sheikh Jaber Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah on 10th March 1996, the tower is 372m tall, which is 40m taller than the Eiffel Tower.

The Liberation Tower is so-named following the multinational coalition that led to liberation of the nation from seven months of Iraqi occupation during the Gulf war.

History

The construction of the tower began before the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait on 2nd August 1990. But, when the invasion happened, the construction of the tower was half-way complete, and had to be put on hold. But as there was no damage to the structure, the construction resumed when the Iraqi forces were expelled on 27th February 1991. Upon its completion in 1993, the tower was renamed "Liberation Tower" representing Kuwait' liberation from Iraq.

Design and Structure

The structure is made using ceramic tiles on the façade from base to first mezzanine level. Three natural light shades render a geometric design from the base. The tower, including the telecommunications complex, is divided into three working areas - a public communications center;

revolving observatory level, and a restaurant at 150 meters; and the adjacent plant and equipment structure.

There are a total of 18 elevators that are amongst the fastest in the world.

As for the revolving mezzanine, there are six office floors spanning 12000 sqm above the revolving observatory level, that rise up and out within a section covered in anodised aluminium, so as to withstand the extreme temperatures.

The tower includes a revolving restaurant and an observation platform, apart from radio and telecommunications offices.

The striking Liberation Tower, with its UFO-like saucer is one among the world's 50 tallest buildings.

I thank all coaches, instructors, athletes and member federations for their participation and active involvement in those events. We look forward to organizing more practical courses and training camps in the coming future.
