1. Introduction to the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026

Date: 19 September to 4 October 2026

Host City: Aichi-Nagoya

Sports: 41 sports

Venues: XX competition venues, XX training venues

Concept:

1.1. Emblem

The smooth curves describe the liveliness of sports.

The center line colored in purple, gold, and green inspires the image that people get together as one and go forward to the future by heading to a bright red sun, the symbol of the OCA. The purple represents the iris, which is the prefectural flower of Aichi. The gold describes "Kinshachi", the golden tiger-fish roof ornaments and the symbol of Nagoya Castle. The green inspires the high environmental consciousness among people of Aichi-Nagoya fostered through EXPO 2005 Aichi, COP10, and the UNESCO World Conference on ESD. The emblem contains the initial letters of Asia, Aichi, and Nagoya. You can see "A" described by the purple curve and the center and the center line and "N" in the purple and the gold.



1.2. Mascot

"HONOHON " was born from the fiery passion that dwells in the hearts of athletes, becoming one with Shachihoko, the guardian deity of Aichi-Nagoya.

Aichi-Nagoya have historically been the birthplace of "Kabukimono", eccentric samurai warriors who excelled in scholarship, martial arts, and the arts. Inspired by this tradition, Honohon features red 'Kumadori' makeup around its eyes, resembling the style used in Kabuki theater.

2. Accreditation and Validation

AINAGOC will distribute the Accreditation Guide to Responsible Organisations in December 2025.

The Accreditation system will be available from XX December 2025 to XX May 2026.

From July 2026 onwards, AINAGOC will produce and deliver the Pre-valid Asian Games Identity and Accreditation Card (PVC) to Responsible Organisations that have confirmed their Accreditation Status Report. Upon arrival in Japan, Games stakeholders will be required to validate their PVC at the Aichi Sky Expo accreditation validation desk or other accreditation facilities by presenting their valid identity documents. After validation at accreditation facilities, PVC becomes Asian Games Identity and Accreditation Card (AGIAC). AGIAC will entitle cardholders to access the venues and zones indicated on their card in order to perform their duties.

3. Validity Period of AGIACs

When accompanied by a valid passport (or equivalent document), PVC or AGIAC will serve as a visa waiver which allows multiple entries when applying for landing into Japan.

The visa waiver period is 50 days before the Opening Ceremony to 15 days after the Closing Ceremony. Between 31 July 2026 and 19 October 2026.

4. Transport

Athletes and team officials will be provided with transport on arrival and departure, for competitions, and for training. Services will be available from XX to XX. AINAGOC will allocate a specific number of dedicated vehicles to each NOC delegation for its exclusive use. Please refer to the Detailed Transport Services Plan for the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026 for more details.

5. Accommodation

A conventional athletes' village will not be built.

During the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026, NOC athletes' and team officials will be accommodated at the Asian Games Plaza* at Garden Pier (container house) and Kinjo Pier (cruise ship), and existing accommodation facilities (hotels, etc.), and necessary functions and services will be provided.

For security, access to the Athletes' Accommodations will require the appropriate accreditation card.

6. Media Services

6.1. Broadcast Mixed Zone

All athletes are required to pass through the Broadcast Mixed Zone after the competition. However, athletes are not obligated to comply with interview requests in this area.

The Broadcast Mixed Zone is directly connected to the Press Mixed Zone, ensuring a seamless transition for athletes and media representatives.

***Medal Ceremony Procedure:**

If an athlete is scheduled to attend the medal ceremony, the Ceremony Producer or Sports Manager will notify the HB and Press Mixed Zone Manager. These athletes will then be escorted to the ceremony briefing area. After the medal ceremony, they will return to the Broadcast Mixed Zone and pass through the area.

6.2. Press Mixed Zone

Athletes must pass through Press Mixed Zone at right after passing through Broadcast Mixed Zone so that they can be interviewed by accredited press as soon as possible after the competition ends. Athletes must undergo Doping test (included but not limited to) after passing through Press Mixed Zone. In case it's occurred after a Press conference, it must be conducted at after the Press Conference.

6.3. Press Conference Room

After the final of each event, in principle, a post-competition press conference will be arranged. At Press conferences, interpreting in 6 languages (Japanese, English, Chinese, Korean, Russian and Arabic) will be provided. Translating a participant's native language into English, if needed, should be done by the Press Attaché(s) or staff of the relevant NOC taking part.

Athletes must undergo Doping test (included but not limited to) after passing through Press Mixed Zone. In case it's occurred after a Press conference, it must be conducted at after the Press Conference.

6.4. FOP Photo Positions

FOP photo positions will be set up in FOPs or FOP surrounding areas in each competition venue. These positions are for accredited photographers to use to take photos of competitions. Accredited photographers will need to wear supplementary access control devices in order to enter FOP photo positions. During the medal ceremony, if necessary, set up a suitable temporary photo position to capture it.

For some events, the shooting at the FOP photo positions may use photo truck(s), photo boat(s), catwalk remote control camera(s), shooting house(s), and underwater remote control camera(s). These special photo positions are provided through the Rate Cards.

6.5. NOC Press Attaché

NOC press attachés with Supplementary access control device(s) will assist in facilitating

interviews between Athletes and Accredited press. They can enter the athletes' side of the Press Mixed Zone, but not the Broadcast Mixed Zone. Where necessary, language support volunteers assist them in their activities.

7. Medical Services

Medical Services During the Games, AINAGOC will run Medical rooms for athletes at each competition venue and provide onsite medical services and emergency transport.

At each athletes' accommodation, medical staff will be stationed to provide necessary care and treatment.

If advanced care and exam are needed, patients will be transferred to the Games' designated hospitals.

If necessary, medical services such as emergency treatment, hospitalization and emergency transfer will be provided.

Onsite Basic medical, emergency transport services will be provided free of charge.

Other medical services shall be paid for in accordance with the provisions stated in the relevant policy for insurance cover.

Free medical services will not include non-essential medical care nor elective medical treatment.

1. Competition Date

The Shooting competition of the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026 will be held from 17 September to 3 October 2024 at Aichi Prefectural General Shooting Gallery.

2. Competition Venue

The Shooting competition of the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026 will be held at Aichi Prefectural General Shooting Gallery.

That is the Japan's leading comprehensive shooting facilities with a rifle range and shotgun range on the premises.

There are 60 targets in 10m Range, 25 targets in 25m Range, 62 targets in 50m Range.

And in the Finals Hall, there are 300 seats. For Skeet & Trap, there are 5 ranges with a total of 200 seats.

25m Qualification will be held in Final Hall.

The Shooting competition will consist of twenty-eight (28) events as follows:

Men's (12) : 50m Rifle 3 Positions ; 10m Air Rifle ; 25m Rapid Fire Pistol ; 10m Air Pistol ; 50m Rifle 3 Positions Team ; 10m Air Rifle Team ; 25m Rapid Fire Pistol Team ; 10m Air Pistol Team ; Trap ; Skeet ; Trap Team ; Skeet Team.

Women's (12) : 50m Rifle 3 Positions ; 10m Air Rifle ; 25m Pistol ; 10m Air Pistol ; 50m Rifle 3 Positions Team ; 10m Air Rifle Team ; 25m Pistol Team ; 10m Air Pistol Team ; Trap ; Skeet ;

Trap Team ; Skeet Team.

Mixed Team (4) : 10m Air Rifle Mixed Team ; 10m Air Pistol Mixed Team ; Trap Mixed Team ;
Skeet Mixed Team .

5. Competition Schedule

6. Competition Rules

The Shooting competition of the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026 will be held as per the current ISSF/ASC Rules and Regulations and ISSF/ASC Constitution.

Detailed information is available on the website of the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF): www.issf-sports.org.

The draw must be made under the supervision of the technical delegate following the procedure described in the ISSF Rules and Regulations.

In case of any disagreement in the language interpretation of the rules and regulations, the English version of the ISSF Rules and Regulations and ISSF Constitution shall prevail. Any unforeseen circumstances not covered by the regulations and rules shall be resolved as follows:

- General issues: Resolved in accordance with the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) Constitution and Rules.
- Technical issues: Resolved in accordance with the ISSF Rules and Regulations.

7. Competition Format

The Competition format will be conducted in accordance with ISSF/ASC Rules and Regulations. Medals in gold, silver, and bronze (gilded, silvered or bronzed) to each member of the first three (3) positions of each team event.

In Mixed team competition, the top four (4) teams should be awarded as follows: two (2) gold medals for team on first position. Two (2) silver medals for team on second position. 4 (four) bronze medals for 2 (two) teams next to them.

2 (two) bronze medal matches should be conducted as follows: match between teams ranked third (3rd) and fifth (5th) in qualification stage and match between teams ranked fourth (4th) and sixth (6th). (ASC Rule 15.5.2)

8. Sport Entries

8.1. Eligibility

- Only NOCs that are members of the OCA are entitled to send athletes to compete in the Shooting competition of the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026.
- Only athletes who comply with the OCA Constitution and Rules and its Byelaws are entitled to compete in the Shooting competition.

8.2. Entry Timeline

- Entry by Sports: Apr 2025 – Jun 2025
- Entry by Number: Jul 2025 – Sep 2025
- Entry by Name (SEQ Period): May 2026 – Jul 2026

8.3. Entry Policies

Individual events

Each NOC may enter a maximum of three (3) athletes per event. Only two athletes (2) per NOC will be qualified for ranking.

Only two (2) of them can go (highest ranking) to compete in the Final for the medals.

Team events

Each NOC may enter a maximum of one (1) team per event, consisted of three (3) athletes.

Three (3) Individual results will count as the Team result and the medals will be awarded.

Mixed team events

Each NOC may enter a maximum of one (1) mixed team per event, including one (1) male athlete and one (1) female athlete. All athletes participating in the corresponding individual events need to be part of the mixed team.

Total

Each NOC may enter a maximum of fifteen (15) male athletes and fifteen (15) female athletes.

Firearm and Ammunition Forms are requested for each NOC and the details refer to the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Firearms and Ammunition Guide.

10. Technical Officials and Jury of Appeal

10.1. Technical Officials

International technical officials must be accredited by the ISSF, and shall be appointed or recommended by the Asian Shooting Confederation (ASC).

National technical officials shall be appointed by the Japan Rifle Shooting Sport Federation (JRSF) and Japan Clay Target Shooting Association (JCSA).

AF/IF has the right to appoint the Technical Delegate and International Technical Officials (ITOs) in coordination and approval of the OCA. In the event of any violation of the AF/IF Rules or Games Rules and Regulations by any participant, the OCA has the right to revoke his or her accreditation card and propose replacement of the participant concerned to the relevant party.

10.2. Jury

The member of Jury shall be appointed by the ASC with the approval of the ISSF. It's made up of:

-Technical Delegate: 2 (Rifle/Pistol = 1, Shotgun = 1)

-ASC coordinator: 1

-Rifle/Pistol: 19

Jury of Appeal: 3(2 foreigners, 1 host) Rifle/Pistol.

RTS Jury: 4 (3 foreigners, 1 host)

Rifle Jury: 4 (3 foreigners, 1 host)

Pistol Jury: 4 (3 foreigners, 1 host)

Equipment Control Jury: 4 (3 foreigners, 1 host)

-Shotgun: 15

Jury of Appeal: 3 (2 foreigners, 1 host)

Shotgun Jury: 6 (4 foreigners, 2 host)

Equipment Control Jury: 3 (2 foreigners, 1 host)

RTS Jury: 3(2 foreigners, 1 host)

11. Team Leaders' Meeting

12. Protests and Appeals

Protests concerning any decisions made by the Technical Delegate shall be handled as per the ISSF Rules and Regulations. All appeals of a technical nature will be the responsibilities of relevant International and Asia Federations. Any athlete/NOC may appeal to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS), in the event that the athlete/NOC believes that there has been a violation of ISSF/ASC. Technical Rules or the OCA Constitution, as long as the appeal is not related to reversing the decision of the referee or the result.

13. Equipment and Clothing

Equipment used and clothing worn by athletes and other relevant participants in the competition must comply with the rules and regulations of the OCA and the ISSF in force. Neither athletes nor technical officials will be permitted to attach any form of commercial advertising to his or her competition uniform without prior approval from the OCA and the Aichi-Nogoya Asian Games Organizing Committee.

14. Doping Control

In order to ensure healthy and fair competitions and protect the interests of the athletes, the Anti-doping programme of the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026 will be conducted in strict accordance with the World Anti-doping Code and the OCA Anti-doping Rules.

15. Victory Ceremony

Gold, silver and bronze medal will be awarded to the athletes ranked the top three of each individual event respectively. In each team event, gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to each of the team members in the top three teams, respectively.

In the Mixed Team event, two (2) bronze medals will be awarded in accordance with ASC Rules and Regulations.

XX minutes before the Victory Ceremony starts, the medalists shall be escorted to the Waiting Area to get ready for the ceremony. Medalists must wear their NOC official uniforms.

16. Sport Information Desk (SID)

All sport-specific information will be available at the Sport Information Desks. They will be located at the competition venue.

5. OCA Constitution

Article 52

- Eligibility Code
 - To be eligible for participation in the OCA GAMES, a competitor must:
 1. Observe and abide by the Rules of the IOC/OCA as per the Olympic Charter;
 2. Respect the spirit of fair play and non-violence and abide by the rules on the sports field;
 3. Comply with all aspects of WADA and OCA Anti-Doping Rules Code and refrain from using substances and drugs prohibited by the said organisations;
 4. The Member must ensure that any competitor in the OCA GAMES must be a national of the country of the NOC, which is entering him;
 5. Disputes relating to the determination of the country which a competitor may represent in the OCA GAMES shall be resolved by the EB, unless the eligibility code already set out in the Constitution has been fulfilled and is not in dispute.
- **Bye-law to Article 52**
 1. *All cases of infringement of IOC Rule 41, 42 and it's Bye-laws and of the eligibility code of IFs shall be communicated by the concerned Member to the OCA, to be considered by the EB whose decision will be final*
 2. *A competitor who is a national of two (2) or more countries at the same time may represent either one (1) of them, as he may elect. However after having represented one country in the Olympic, Asian continental regional or world championships recognised by the relevant IF, the competitor may not represent another country unless he or she meets the conditions set forth in sub section 4 below that apply to the persons who has changed his nationality or acquired a new nationality;*
 3. *A competitor who has represented one country in the Olympic Games, OCA GAMES , continental, regional, and world championships recognised by the relevant IF, and who has changed his nationality or acquired a new nationality, shall not participate in the OCA GAMES to represent his new country until three years after such change or acquisition;*
 4. *If a State, Country or a colony acquires independence, a country becomes incorporated within another country by a change of border or transfer of sovereignty or if a new NOC is recognised by the OCA, a competitor may continue to represent the country to which he belong or belonged. However, he may, if preferred, choose to represent his country or be entered in the OCA GAMES by his new NOC if one exists. This option can only be made once and is irreversible;*

5. *In all cases not expressly addressed in these Bye-Laws, in particular those cases where a competitor would be in a position to represent a country other than that of which he is a national, or to have choice as to the country which he intends to represent, the EB makes all decisions. Decisions can be of a general or individual nature and issue specific requirements relating to nationality, citizenship, domicile or residence of the competitors, including the duration of any waiting period;*
6. *Except as permitted by the EB, no competitor, coach or official who participates in the OCA GAMES may allow his person, name and picture or sports performances to be used for advertising purposes during the OCA GAMES.*

Article 53

- Necessary Conditions for representing a Country
1. Only nationals of member NOCs are eligible to represent that country in the OCA GAMES. Where a competitor's nationality is the subject of scrutinization, evidence (passport, residency & other documents) must be produced to support and meet definition of eligibility, according to the rules prevailing in the particular sport in which the competitor wishes to take part. It is not permissible for a competitor having once represented a country in the OCA GAMES or any international sports competition such as Olympic Games, Asian Games, World Games, Continental Games, Regional Games etc., to represent a different country in the future unless:
 - a. The former country or place of birth has since been incorporated in another State;
 - b. Or if he/she competed for the former country because the NOC or Chief National Organisation of their native land was not a Member of the OCA at that time;
 - c. The rules in relation to Article 49 byelaw 4 are met.
 2. Competitors will be eligible if they comply with the following qualifications:
 - a. That they were born in the country they represent;
 - b. That they are nationals or citizens of the country they represent and have lived there continuously for a period of not less than three years;
 - c. That they have become naturalised in the country they represent and have permanent residence there.
 3. Competitors born outside Asia cannot be qualified unless they meet conditions in 2 b & c,

where applicable.

- ***Bye-law to Article 53***

The OCA will have the full authority for disqualification of any athlete in all matters other than technical.

Article 54

- Age Limit
 - There is no age limit for competitors in the OCA GAMES, unless the IF and/or AFs prescribe otherwise and is approved by the EB apart from AYG which has an age restriction of 14-17 years.
