### 1. Competition Date

The Shooting competition of the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026 will be held from 17 September to 3 October 2026 at Aichi Prefectural General Shooting Gallery.

### 2. Competition Venue

The Shooting competition of the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026 will be held at Aichi Prefectural General Shooting Gallery.

That is the Japan's leading comprehensive shooting facilities with a rifle range and shotgun range on the premises.

There are 60 targets in 10m Range, 25 targets in 25m Range, 62 targets in 50m Range. And in the Finals Hall, there are 300 seats. For Skeet & Trap, there are 5 ranges with a total of 200 seats.

25m Qualification will be held in Final Hall.

## 6. Competition Rules

The Shooting competition of the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026 will be held as per the current ISSF/ASC Rules and Regulations and ISSF/ASC Constitution.

Detailed information is available on the website of the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF): [www.issf-sports.org](http://www.issf-sports.org).

The draw must be made under the supervision of the technical delegate following the procedure described in the ISSF Rules and Regulations.

In case of any disagreement in the language interpretation of the rules and regulations, the English version of the ISSF Rules and Regulations and ISSF Constitution shall prevail.

Any unforeseen circumstances not covered by the regulations and rules shall be resolved as follows:

- General issues: Resolved in accordance with the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) Constitution and Rules.
- Technical issues: Resolved in accordance with the ISSF Rules and Regulations.

## 7. Competition Format

The competition format will be conducted in accordance with ISSF/ASC Rules and Regulations.

Medals in gold, silver, and bronze (gilded, silvered or bronzed) will be awarded to each member of the first three (3) positions of each team event.

In Mixed team competition, the top three (3) teams should be awarded as follows: two (2) gold medals for team in first position. Two (2) silver medals for team in second position. Two (2) bronze medals for team next to them.

## 8. Sport Entries

### 8.1. Eligibility

- Only NOCs that are members of the OCA are entitled to send athletes to compete in the Shooting competition of the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026.
- Only athletes who comply with the OCA Constitution and Rules and its Byelaws are entitled to compete in the Shooting competition.

### 8.2. Entry Timeline

- Entry by Sport: 12 Jun 2025 – 07 Jul 2025
- Preliminary Entry by Number: 18 July 2025 - 16 September 2025
- Entry by Number – Second Round: 08 December 2025 - 31 January 2026
- Entry by Name (SEQ Period): 01 May 2026 - 01 July 2026

### 8.3. Entry Policies

- Individual events

Each NOC may enter a maximum of three (3) athletes per event. Only two athletes (2) per NOC will be qualified for ranking.

Only two (2) of them can go (highest ranking) to compete in the Final for the medals.

- Team events

Each NOC may enter a maximum of one (1) team per event, consisted of three (3) athletes.

Three (3) Individual results will count as the Team result and the medals will be awarded.

- Mixed team events

Each NOC may enter a maximum of one (1) mixed team per event, including one (1) male athlete and one (1) female athlete. Mixed team participants must also be entered in an individual event.

- Total

Each NOC may enter a maximum of fifteen (15) male athletes and fifteen (15) female athletes.

Firearm and Ammunition Forms are requested for each NOC and the details refer to the 20<sup>th</sup> Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Firearms and Ammunition Guide.

## 10. Technical Officials and Jury of Appeal

### 10.1. Technical Officials

International technical officials must be accredited by the ISSF, and shall be appointed or recommended by the Asian Shooting Confederation (ASC).

National technical officials shall be appointed by the Japan Rifle Shooting Sport Federation (JRSSF) and Japan Clay Target Shooting Association (JCSA).

AF/IF has the right to appoint the Technical Delegate and International Technical Officials (ITOs) in coordination and approval of the OCA. In the event of any violation of the AF/IF Rules or Games Rules and Regulations by any participant, the OCA has the right to revoke his or her accreditation card and propose replacement of the participant concerned to the relevant party.

## 10.2. Jury

The member of Jury shall be appointed by the ASC with the approval of the ISSF. It's made up of:

- Technical Delegate: 2 (Rifle/Pistol = 1, Shotgun = 1)
- ASC coordinator: 1
- Rifle/Pistol: 23
  - Jury of Appeal: 3 (2 foreigners, 1 host)
  - RTS Jury: 5 (4 foreigners, 1 host)
  - Rifle Jury: 5 (4 foreigners, 1 host)
  - Pistol Jury: 5 (4 foreigners, 1 host)
  - Equipment Control Jury: 5 (4 foreigners, 1 host)
- Shotgun: 12
  - Jury of Appeal: 3 (2 foreigners, 1 host)
  - Shotgun Jury: 4 (3 foreigners, 1 host)
  - Equipment Control Jury: 3 (2 foreigners, 1 host)
  - RTS Jury: 2(1 foreigner, 1 host)

Shotgun Referee: - Total 16 (four (4) per range)

Fifteen (15) referees shall be from foreign countries, and any additional referees shall be appointed from Japan.

In case of a Jury member or Referee is not available to be nominated from the host country in any of the above categories, AINAGOC will appoint from any other Asian Federation.

## 12. Protests and Appeals

Protests concerning any decisions made by the Technical Delegate shall be handled as per the ISSF Rules and Regulations. All appeals of a technical nature will be the responsibilities of relevant International and Asia Federations. Any athlete/NOC may appeal to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS), in the event that the athlete/NOC believes that there has been a violation of ISSF/ASC. Technical Rules or the OCA Constitution, as long as the appeal is not related to reversing the decision of the referee or the result.

## 13. Equipment and Clothing

Equipment used and clothing worn by athletes and other relevant participants in the competition must comply with the rules and regulations of the OCA and the ISSF in force. Neither athletes nor technical officials will be permitted to attach any form of commercial advertising to his or her competition uniform without prior approval from the OCA and the Aichi-Nagoya Asian Games Organizing Committee.

## 14. Doping Control

In order to ensure healthy and fair competitions and protect the interests of the athletes, the Anti-doping programme of the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026 will be conducted in strict accordance with the World Anti-doping Code and the OCA Anti-doping Rules.

All athletes heading to the Games will need to complete the ADEL, which is provided by WADA, for International Level Athlete (ILA) e-learning module and all coaches will need to complete the ADEL for Coaches of High Performance (CHP) e-learning module successfully. The completed certificate will need to be uploaded online during registration without which registration will not be successful. We strongly encourage you to start on this early. Further details are currently under consideration within the OCA, so please wait until the publication of the Doping Control Guide in April 2026.

## 15. Victory Ceremony

Gold, silver, and bronze medals will be awarded to the athletes ranked in the top three of each individual event according to the official results.

In team events, gold, silver, and bronze medals will be awarded to the athletes of the teams placing first, second, and third.

In mixed team events, bronze medals will be awarded to the teams finishing in joint third place.

The Victory Ceremony will start approximately 15 minutes after the final. To prepare for the ceremony, the medalists shall be escorted to the Waiting Area 10 minutes before the ceremony starts. A detailed timeline will be announced in the ceremony implementation plan.

Medalists must wear their NOC official uniforms. Medalists are not allowed to bring personal items.

Medal cases and bags will be provided after the ceremony on the way to the media mix zone.

In addition, diplomas will be awarded to all athletes of the top six (6) according to the official results at a later date.

## **16. Sport Information Desk (SID)**

All sport-specific information for Shooting will be available at the Sport Information Desks. They will be located at the competition venue and the Sport Information Centre (SIC) in the NOC Service Centre. And at each athletes' accommodation, the Games Information Desk will offer limited support.
